However, it is too expensive compared to top-tier brands just like Norton 360 and McAfee. The cheapest plan covers only 1 device, while the higher priced ones cover up to 15 devices.

The program uses a cloud-based examination to analyze documents and their qualities, and DoubleScan technology uses two scanning services engines to get maximum security. It updates anti-virus signatures by using an hourly basis. The program likewise protects against phishing websites, blocks manipulated apps that resemble input keys to infect your PC, and scans the contents of the USB drives for risks.

A 'data backup' characteristic enables you to make an encrypted archive on the data on your computer. You can select your source files, timetable the backup job to run automatically, and add username and password protection to the archive. Yet, the option to burn off your copies to CD/DVD and to make local backups are only accessible in the more costly G Info Total Reliability suite. Keylogger protection is mostly a welcome addition, but it will only work with a little selection of applications, including several Bitcoin billfolds.
